Began in 1983, this program brings a world-renowned musician to Christ Church each year, and what stellar people we have had working in our midst—Stephen Cleobury, Gerre Hancock, Philip Ledger, James Litton, Andrew Lumsden, Philip Moore, James O'Donnell, Simon Preston, Christopher Robinson, John Rutter, and Sir David Willcocks. We Welcome James O'Donnell as our Musician in Residence - Today

We are pleased to welcome James O'Donnell back to Christ Church as this year's Musician in Residence. One of the most celebrated concert organists, choral conductors, and liturgical musicians of our time, he served for more than a decade as Master of Music at Westminster Cathedral and for more than two decades as Organist and Master of the Choristers at Westminster Abbey. In 2023, Mr. O'Donnell left London for a position on the faculty of the Institute of Sacred Music and the School of Music at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. He will speak about his musical career at 9:50 AM in the Parish Hall today and then direct the Christ Church Choir in worship at 10:30 AM and 4 PM.
